Officer Brie will assist the department with child exploitation investigations, warrant searches, and is expected to become dual certified in the future as an emotional support animal. Chief Plane invited the Mayor and Council to visit the Police Department at a later date to observe a demonstration of K-9 Officer Brie’s capabilities.

Mayor Calvert did not provide a formal report but shared that she was honored to recently attend the Muscogee (Creek) Nation’s latest court proceedings and updates. The Tribe announced the appointment of five judges who will travel to hear cases arising north of Highway 116, including traffic, criminal, and domestic violence matters. Mayor Calvert also noted that, through her attendance, an invitation was extended to Glenpool Police Chief Jeremy Plane to visit the new tribal court facilities in Jenks to observe the proceedings and view the new program spaces.

RE: Formal Demand for Settlement – Battery, Civil Rights Violations, and Municipal Negligence

Dear City Manager,

I am writing to formally notify you of a serious incident that occurred at the Glenpool City Hall on June 4, 2025. I was assaulted by a city employee—identified as a secretary—while lawfully exercising my First Amendment right to document and report on public activities within the facility. This letter outlines the facts, legal basis for claims, damages sustained, and a proposed resolution intended to avoid protracted litigation.

I. Statement of Facts

While filming a public segment for my YouTube channel, @TheMeans3, which focuses on civil rights and government accountability, I entered Glenpool City Hall to gather footage and engage in lawful inquiry related to public records and possible government misconduct.

A city secretary (public employee) unlawfully placed her hands on me, grabbing both my hand and camera, effectively committing an unprovoked battery against me on public property.

After the incident, I immediately requested that law enforcement be called to report the battery. I also requested to speak with either the city manager or city attorney—both of which were denied or disregarded. Compounding the matter, I made repeated attempts to identify the staff member involved. However, city employees either refused to provide her name, gave vague or evasive responses, or claimed not to know her name at all, despite her being stationed at the front desk and actively working in a public-facing capacity.

The entire incident was documented on video and has since garnered over 120,000 views online, causing significant emotional distress, embarrassment, and disruption to my professional activities as a civil rights investigator and journalist.

II. Legal Violations and Grounds for Liability

The following claims and violations are implicated:

1. Battery (Tort)
2. Violation of 42 U.S.C. § 1983 - Civil Rights Act
3. Negligent Supervision and Failure to Train
4. Violation of the Oklahoma Open Records Act (51 O.S. § 24A.5)
5. Failure to Report a Crime

III. Harm and Damages

This incident has caused:

- Significant emotional distress and public humiliation
- Damage to my professional reputation as a journalist and investigator
- Fear and apprehension about continuing my work without retaliation
- A chilling effect on protected speech and public accountability efforts
- Disruption of my ongoing investigations and commercial activities, including drone-based cinematic marketing and investigative reporting for Guerrilla Publishing

IV. Preservation of Evidence and Spoliation Notice

You are hereby instructed to preserve all evidence related to this incident, including but not limited to:

- Lobby and security camera footage
- Emails and internal communications discussing the event
- Visitor logs and employee reports
- Disciplinary files for the involved employee

Any alteration or destruction of such records may result in sanctions for spoliation of evidence.

V. Settlement Proposal

To resolve this matter amicably, I propose the following terms:

1. A one-time monetary settlement of \$25,000.00
2. A formal written apology from the City of Glenpool
3. Appropriate disciplinary action and retraining of the involved staff
4. Commitment to allow continued press access to public areas and compliance with state open records laws

This settlement includes a mutual agreement to cease further litigation, and I will suspend any and all future media coverage, investigative activity, or content production focused on Glenpool and its employees. Additionally, this settlement would preclude the involvement of Ronald Durbin II and the Guerrilla Publishing media team from pursuing or amplifying future claims related to this matter.

VI. Deadline and Further Action

Please respond to this demand within 14 calendar days of receipt. Failure to respond or engage in settlement negotiations will result in the immediate preparation of formal legal action, including but not limited to:

- Civil tort claims in Oklahoma court
- Federal civil rights suit under 42 U.S.C. § 1983
- Request for injunctive relief and punitive damages

I am prepared to move forward with litigation and will be represented by Mr. Ronald Durbin II should this matter not be resolved voluntarily.

Summary:

Resolution No. 2025013 urges the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) to take immediate action on the SH-67 Corridor Study, which was adopted by the Glenpool City Council on September 3, 2024. The study outlines critical safety and infrastructure improvements along SH-67 (151st Street), including intersection upgrades and speed limit reductions.

Key Points:

- Glenpool submitted revisions to ODOT in April and July 2024; no response has been received.
- Formal requests for signalization and speed limit reductions were submitted between 2020 and 2025.
- A juvenile fatality occurred in September 8, 2025 at a SH-67 intersection, highlighting the urgency of improvements.
- Glenpool PD reports 26 injury crashes and 2 fatalities on SH-67 in 2025 alone.

Resolution Requests:

1. Prioritize implementation of the SH-67 Corridor Study.
 2. Provide a timeline for intersection improvements.
 3. Implement speed limit reductions and school zone safety measures.
 4. Reaffirm Glenpool's commitment to collaboration with ODOT and stakeholders.

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2025013 to formally request ODOT's prompt action on SH-67 safety improvements.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENPOOL, OKLAHOMA, URGING THE OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (ODOT) TO TAKE PROMPT ACTION ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STATE HIGHWAY 67 CORRIDOR STUDY TO ADDRESS SAFETY AND INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS ALONG THE CORRIDOR WITHIN THE CITY OF GLENPOOL

WHEREAS, the City of Glenpool, in partnership with the City of Bixby, INCOG, and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), participated in the development and approval of the State Highway 67 Corridor Study to assess and improve transportation infrastructure and safety along the Highway 67 corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Corridor Study was completed, revised, and formally adopted by the Glenpool City Council on September 3, 2024, identifying critical intersection improvements and safety enhancements necessary to support current and future traffic demands; and

WHEREAS, ODOT requested modifications to the study and Glenpool submitted revisions in April 15 and July 17 of 2024 with no comments received since that revision was sent; and

WHEREAS, the City of Glenpool has actively engaged with ODOT to move forward with the implementation of the study's recommendations, including a request for signalization at the Broadway intersection on October 23, 2020; a formal proposal to reduce SH-67 speed limits between Elwood Avenue and the US 75/SH 67 intersection on January 23, 2023, followed by additional correspondence on January 16, 2024; and a formal letter issued on March 12, 2025, submitting the finalized SH-67 Corridor Study and identifying the SH-67/Broadway intersection as a priority location for a new stoplight, yet progress has stalled despite the City's readiness and commitment to collaborate; and

WHEREAS, a recent tragic accident at an intersection along Highway 67 within Glenpool resulted in the loss of a juvenile life, underscoring the urgent need for safety improvements and the implementation of the Corridor Study's recommendations; and

WHEREAS, collision data from the Glenpool Police Department shows a troubling trend, with 26 injury crashes and 2 fatalities already reported on Highway 67 in 2025 alone, highlighting the persistent and escalating danger on this corridor; and

WHEREAS, the City of Glenpool believes that timely action by ODOT is essential to prevent further loss of life and to ensure the safety and well-being of all residents and travelers along the corridor;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENPOOL, OKLAHOMA:

1. That the City of Glenpool formally urges the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to prioritize and initiate the implementation of the State Highway 67 Corridor Study recommendations within the Glenpool city limits.
2. That the City of Glenpool requests ODOT to provide a timeline and actionable steps for the commencement of intersection improvements and other safety measures identified in the study.
3. That the City of Glenpool urges ODOT to implement speed limit reductions and enhanced school zone safety measures along SH-67. The Corridor Study recommends targeted speed limit reductions and the installation of speed feedback signs and other countermeasures to mitigate crash severity and improve driver awareness. These measures are critical for protecting students and pedestrians and should be prioritized as short-term safety improvements.
4. That the City of Glenpool remains committed to working collaboratively with ODOT and all relevant stakeholders to expedite these improvements and ensure the safety of its community.
5. That a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to ODOT, INCOG, and the City of Bixby to reaffirm Glenpool's commitment and to encourage coordinated action.
